People nowadays are greatly attracted by technical education, and naturally, too. But we should also remember that technical education without the complement of humanistic studies will be imperfect, lopsided and deficient. It is possible for us, by the control we have obtained over the forces of nature, to bring about paradise on earth. It is equally possible for us, by pressing a button, to destroy continents. If the choice is to be made wisely, we must be cultivated in the art of civilized life. Humanistic training and technical study must be regarded as complementary to each other. They should not be regarded as divorced or as separated from each other. The more important thing referred to was social education. Even so many institutions, which we have loved and in which we have lived, have fallen from our eyes.
